

Frequently Asked Questions

What are your hours?

All classes are from 9:30 am to 1:00 pm. The Preschool office is open from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.

What classes do you offer?

- 2-day 2s (meets Monday/Wednesday)
- 3-day 3s (meets Monday/Wednesday/Friday)
- 4-day 3 (meets Monday – Thursday)
- 5-day 3s (meets Monday – Friday)
- 4-day 4s (meets Monday – Thursday)
- 5-day 4s (meets Monday – Friday)

What is the tuition for each class?

- 2-days: \$200
- 3-days: \$240
- 4-days: \$290
- 5-days: \$310

What are the registration fees?

The following registration fees are one-time payments, and paying the registration fees secures your child's spot in the class.

- \$175 registration fee (helps purchase school supplies)
- \$100 activity fee (helps with supplies for special events)
- \$25 cleaning fee (helps with supplies needed due to the increased cleaning done to combat COVID-19)

How do I tour the preschool?

You can tour the preschool by setting up an appointment in advance. Tours are given outside of school hours starting at 1:15 pm. Please call Beth, the Director, at 770-476-8716, or email Beth at preschool@pleasanthillpc.org.

What if I can't do all the days or can't do a certain day?

It is beneficial for your child to try to come for all of the days they are registered for in the class. If you are having problems coming for the full week, a different class with different days may work better for you. If your child does not attend for the full week (2, 3, or 4-day classes), you cannot pick which days they attend. Your child can only come on the days available for that class.

You're a Christian preschool?

Yes, we are a Christian preschool, and the church is a Presbyterian church. However, we accept families of all faiths and backgrounds. The central message from Christianity we teach kids is that God loves you for who you are and we show love and kindness to everyone.

Do you have any before or after school programs?

We do not offer any before or after school programs.

Are you a Georgia Pre-K?

No, we are not a Georgia Pre-K, but we do follow the same kindergarten readiness standards set forth by Georgia Bright from the Start. A benefit of attending our 4s Pre-K class is that the small class size with two teachers allows for your child to receive lots of individual attention to help them develop the emotional, social, and academic skills needed to thrive in kindergarten. As kindergarten has gotten more rigorous, our Pre-K class has adapted to meet the increased fine and gross motor skills, as well as critical thinking skills, needed for kindergarten readiness.

Do you provide a lunch?

No, we do not provide a lunch. You will pack a lunch for your child every day, and we ask that you pack a healthy, filling lunch to provide your child with the physical and mental energy they need to learn. If your child does not know how to feed themselves, start working on that skill to prepare them for school.

Do you have classes in the summer?

No, we do not have regular classes in the summer. Our school year is from September through the middle of May. However, we do offer summer camps in June, July, and August. We typically offer a week of camp in June and July, and two weeks of camp in August. Each week of camp is from 9:30 am to 1:00 pm and costs \$150 per week.

What is your curriculum?

Our preschool has a play-based curriculum because we believe that children learn best through play. Through play, children work on their fine and gross motor skills, remain active through frequent movement, learn to solve problems on their own, work on their vocabulary and language skills, and learn how to cooperate, take turns, and wait. Our preschool follows the standards provided by Georgia Bright from the Start.

My child has a lot of separation anxiety. What can I do?

You can start practicing having your child be away from you by having a trusted friend or family member watch your child for 30 minutes. Read books and watch TV episodes about waiting for grownups to come back. Talk with your child about it after reading and watching. Our summer camps are also a great way for your child to practice being away from you before school starts. You can also talk with your child about their school day by going over the schedule the teacher will provide at Parent Orientation and/or Meet Your Teacher.
